

Adding, Editing, or Removing Favorites/Bookmarks

What are the 3 steps to Adding a new Favorite/Bookmark to your Bookmark Bar?



How can you get to the screen to Edit either the Name or Location/folder or to Remove/Delete a Favorite/Bookmark?

Note: When you click to Remove/Delete a bookmark it often does not have a 'Are you Sure?' message so be careful. Also note—you now know how to add a Favorite/Bookmark to your browser – so if you do accidentally delete one—you can fix that 😊

> PRACTICE NOW – Favorites/Bookmarks Practice (Favorites video)

- □ Open a new tab and go to SeniorTechConnect.Net
- Find the 'Star' icon to mark the site as a favorite/bookmark—click on the 'Star'
 This adds it to your Favorites/Bookmark bar for easy access later
 Rename it for a shorter name to show in your favorites/bookmarks bar
- □ Return to the YouTube video tab and un-pause the video ***
- □ Click on the video or click on the pause/play button
- □ After the video is over—practice what you've learned in your Browser
- □ Add your favorite websites to your Favorites/Bookmark bar
 - Type the website in the address bar once there click on the 'Star'
 - Rename your favorite if the name they put in automatically is too long
- □ Remove any Favorites/Bookmarks that you don't use
- □ Edit any you want to rename

***What to do if you lose/close the Video tab during the PRACTICE NOW

To return/find this video again after practice if you have accidentally closed it

Open a new tab in your browser - Go to SeniorTechConnect.Net

Go to the 'Videos and Note Sheets' page

Look in the chart and find this video-click on its name to open this video


Once in YouTube in this video - look in the description below the video

What to Do When your Favorites/Bookmark Bar Disappears

How is this done in YOUR preferred browser?


1 – Click on 3 dots to bring up menu options

2 – Click on 'Bookmarks' (or Favorites in some Browsers)

3 - Click on 'Show Bookmarks bar'

Some Browsers give you options for when to see the bar

> PRACTICE NOW – Favorites/Bookmarks Bar disappears (Favorites video)

- □ Find the 3 dots to open up the Browser's menu
- □ Click on Favorites (or Bookmarks depending on your browser)
- □ Click on 'Show (or Hide) Bookmarks bar'
- □ Practice making it appear and disappear
- □ Open a new tab does it show there?
- □ Return to the YouTube video tab *** and un-pause the video (Click on the video or click on the pause/play button)
- *** See instructions in 1st practice to find video again if you have accidentally closed it
